When we are called to intercessory prayer we have to pray the will of God and proclaim the things of God as though we were the only ones praying and proclaiming even though there are thousands of us doing it. Abraham was only one man but he obeyed God and received the promise of God. Moses was only one man but he led the Hebrew children out of Egypt and through the Red sea. Hebrews 1:1-3 "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had <u>by Himself</u> purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,"

Romans 5:15 "But the free gift is not like the offense. For if by the <u>one man's</u> offense many died, much more the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the <u>one Man</u>, Jesus Christ, abounded to many."

Romans 5:17-19 "For if by the <u>one man's offense</u> death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the <u>One, Jesus Christ.</u>) Therefore, as through <u>one man's offense</u> judgment came to all men, resulting in condemnation, even so through <u>one Man's righteous act</u> the free gift came to all men, resulting in justification of life. For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so also by <u>one Man's obedience</u> many will be made righteous."

2 Corinthians 5:18-19 (Amplified Bible) But all things are from God, Who through Jesus Christ reconciled us to Himself [received us into favor, brought us into harmony with Himself] and gave to us the ministry of reconciliation [that by word and deed we might aim to bring others into harmony with Him]. It was God [personally present] in Christ, reconciling and restoring the world to favor with Himself, not counting up and holding against [men] their trespasses [but cancelling them], and committing to us the message of reconciliation (of the restoration to favor).

God is calling us to be intercessors. Will you be one to proclaim the things of God on the earth?

Isaiah 59:16 "He saw that there was no man, And wondered that there was no intercessor; Therefore His own arm brought salvation for Him; And His own righteousness, it sustained Him."

Let's pray until His Kingdom comes and His will is done on earth as it is in Heaven.
